We have the painful duty of recording the death of Reason Meek, one of our oldest and best citizens, which event occurred last Tuesday, the 12th. He had been to Jim McGinnis' and was just starting home, when he complained of a very great pain in his side. He went back in the house and was dead in a few moments. It is supposed heart failure was the cause. His sons, James and Samuel, living in Kansas, were telegraphed for, and arrived Wednesday evening. On Thursday the remains were followed to the Heflin graveyard by a large concourse of friends. He leaves a wife and five children, all of whom are grown. His bereaved family have our heartfelt sympathy in this great affliction. In him the community has lost an estimable citizen, the friends a model neighbor, the wife a beloved husband, and the children a kind and honored parent. Father Forsha delivered the funeral oration.

There will be preaching at Sunrise the first Sunday in June by the Rev. Gilbert Hays.

Jim Meek was very sick the night after his father's funeral.

We learn that Jim Meek is talking of selling his property in Kansas and moving back on his old home farm.

Death of Former Resident.

Mrs. Matilda Meek, formerly of Nodaway county, died at her home in Nehama county, Kansas, Tuesday, October 14, after a week's illness. Mrs. Meek was born in Ohio in 1826. Three sons and one daughter survive in Nehama county and another son and grand son in this county. Funeral services were held at Wilcox, Missouri, and the body buried in Heflin cemetery.
