**ELDON GRIFFEY, 54,
DIES IN HOSPITAL**

Eldon G. Griffey, 54, Maryville, died at 7:15 a. m. today at the St. Francis Hospital where he had been a patient for 12 days following brief illness.

He was born Oct. 16, 1911, at Burlington Jct. and was the son of Mrs. Myrtle Griffey Hull, and the late Carl Cleo Griffey. He was married May 29, 1933 to Miss Frances E. Hainline, at Gering, Neb. He had been a resident of Maryville, for the past three years but had lived all his life in Nodaway County. He was employed by the Lawhon Construction Co., working at Northwest State College at the time of his illness. He was a member of the Wilcox Methodist Church.
